

Edmonton Folk Music Festival Information for Cloverdale Residents

Parking Policy for 2007

The parking policy changes that came into effect in 2006 have been updated for 2007 to support residents with home businesses as well we are introducing a visitor parking pass pool for residences interested in putting their name into a draw for visitor passes donated by other residents who don't require them and are willing to donate them to the pool. Aside from these to these two changes, the 2006 parking policy will remain in effect for our 2007 Folk Music Festival.

On-street parking passes (visitor parking) will be allocated based on the amount of on-street parking that is adjacent to your property (to a maximum of two per residence). The 3 neighbourhood access passes per residence will remain in effect (ie. residents can park in their garages or on their garage pads). *NOTE: Residents are not allowed to park on the street using only a neighbourhood access pass; an on-street parking pass is also required.*

The majority of residents in our neighbourhood will continue to receive 2 on-street parking passes (visitor parking).

However, the following are situations where residents will receive less than 2 on-street parking passes (visitor parking) –

Homes and Condominiums / Apartments on the east side of 92 Street where there is no on-street parking allowed. These residents will receive no-on street parking passes.

Residents on 98 Avenue that are NOT on a corner lot (this assumes the city will not allow you to park on 98 Avenue) will receive no on-street parking passes.

The Condominium Association for condominiums on 98 Avenue where the units are also on a corner lot(s), will receive 5 on-street parking passes per corner lot (it will be up to the Condominium Association to determine the best way to distribute the allocated passes within their association). Representative from the Condominium Association will need to pick up the on-street parking passes for their condominium complex. The neighbourhood access passes will still need to be picked up by each resident.

The River's Edge Condominium complex (the fourplex's located on 91 Street, off of 98 Avenue) will receive 1 visitor pass per residence (4 passes per fourplex).

For the impacted residents noted above, if 1 or 2 additional neighbourhood access passes are required during the Folk Festival event, these can be requested at the time of pass pick up. This assumes these residences have room on their property (ie. garage pad) for visitors to park. *NOTE: these are not the on-street parking passes, only neighbourhood access passes. Residents can make this type of special request when they are picking up your passes.*

The executive encourage residents to park on the street only as necessary during the Festival.

On-street parking passes allow residents to park on the street during the Festival without being ticketed. The neighbourhood access passes are used to access the neighbourhood in resident cars. The City of Edmonton

puts up signs restricting the parking on Cloverdale streets during the Festival. These passes are not intended to be sold or used for commercial interests. The executive ask that this policy be respected so we can all enjoy a workable parking policy for all Cloverdale residents.

Valid Home Business: If you have a City of Edmonton approved home business and will be negatively impacted by this policy, please email the CCL executive prior to the parking pass pick up date. The CCL executive will review your business license and will review your situation (number of employees, approved clients, etc) and will work with your business to ensure the Folk Fest does not negatively impact your business.

Visitor Pass Pool: If you do not need your allotted visitor passes, you can make your extra visitor passes available to the Cloverdale visitor pass pool. Residents that are interested in extra visitor passes can make their name/phone number known to the CCL executive (via email or at wrist band pass distribution) and the CCL executive will randomly draw on Wednesday night and Thursday night of wrist band distribution. All CCL visitor passes will be made randomly available to those who have submitted their names/phone numbers and have been logged as requesting additional passes.

Propriety owners that are having construction work performed on their residence during the Festival must apply in advance to the CCL executive if they wish to request additional visitor parking passes for their construction workers.

Finally, only residents of Cloverdale are eligible for parking passes. Property owners must be residents to be eligible to parking passes, if owners cannot prove they are residents of Cloverdale, they will not be allocated any parking passes.

The Landing: Residents of The Landing should pick up their parking passes from their condo association parking pass distributor Marion Morstead at 450-3427.

If you are aware of an illegally parked vehicle, either on your property or on the street without a valid street parking pass, you are encouraged to contact the head of the traffic crew for the Edmonton Folk Music Festival who will make the appropriate contacts to have the vehicle ticketed and towed. A contact name and number for this purpose will be made available at the time parking passes are distributed.

You will be asked to sign for your passes as you did last year. On street parking and neighbourhood access passes will be distributed at the Bennett Centre as follows:

Wednesday, August 8	7:00 pm to 9:00 pm
Thursday, August 9	5:00 pm to 7:00 pm

If you are unclear on how this policy may impact your residence, please feel free to contact any one of your Cloverdale Community Executive members or email your questions to cloverdalecommunityleague@hotmail.com before the pass distribution date noted above. A thorough inventory of the neighbourhood has been conducted to determine whether your home can accommodate on-street parking, so we can advise you immediately whether you are impacted by this or not.
